



Academic Scholarships

Applications should be made to the Registrar's office by 18 May 2018.

Preparatory School: Year 7

Half tuition fees. Up to two awarded, for two years, after examination and interview.

Middle School: Year 9

Half tuition fees for five years. Up to five may be awarded, after examination and interview.

E.N.T. Reese Memorial

Up to \$1000 is awarded to the St Andrew's student with the top academic performance in Year 12, provided he or she is returning to the College for Year 13. No application is required.

Music Scholarships

Requests for applications should be made to the Registrar's office by 18 May 2018.

Preparatory School: Year 7

Half tuition fees for two years. One scholarship is awarded each year, by audition.

Middle School: Year 9

Tuition fee reduction (usually 50%) for five years. Up to four awarded each year, by audition. Instrumental tuition costs may be offered to top candidates.

Pipe Band: Year 9

Up to half tuition fees reviewed year-by-year for up to five years, for pipers and drummers. Up to two scholarships awarded, by audition and interview.

Sir Ben Dickinson Music

Up to \$500 is awarded annually to the most promising St Andrew's student in Years 12 or 13, to be used for instrument purchase or private music tuition. No application is required.

Sports / Cultural Scholarships

Sports Scholarships: Year 9

We offer 10 Year 9 sports scholarships for high-achieving students in the core sports of rugby, netball, basketball, hockey, football, cricket and tennis. Scholarships are to the value of \$2000 and are a one-off reduction against 2017 tuition fees. Applications close 18 May 2018.

There is also a sports scholarship offering a 50% reduction in tuition fees for five years with all sports eligible. Additional needs-based financial support can be applied for. Applications close 18 May 2018.

Sports and Cultural Scholarships: Years 11–13

Applications should be received at the Registrar's office by 14 September 2018.

Academic tuition fee reductions are available to students of outstanding ability in sporting or cultural areas, supported by sound academic progress. These awards are offered to senior students entering the College at Years 12 or 13.

Bursaries

Applications should be made to the Financial Accountant by the end of September.

Ratray Memorial

Up to \$600 is awarded each year to a current student who deserves financial assistance.

Richard Adair Memorial

Up to \$400 is awarded each year to a current student who deserves financial assistance.

Duncan Rutherford Memorial

Up to \$600 is awarded to assist a current student to return for Year 13.

\$1500 is awarded to the top Year 12 student who is returning for Year 13 French. No application is required.

GAM Hilson Piping and Drumming

Piping or drumming tuition fees for one year are awarded to the most promising piper and promising drummer. Apply to the Old Collegians Secretary by 29 September.

GAM Hilson Accounting / Economics Memorial Award

\$1500 will be awarded to a Year 12 student at the beginning of Year 13 who intends to study Economics or Accounting at university the following year. No application is required.

George Feilding Hight Scholarship

Applications should be made to the Registrar's office by 18 May 2018.

A needs-based scholarship for a new student (Year 9) from a rural community in the South Island.

All scholarships are reviewed annually.

Scholarship holders will have their conduct and their co-curricular and academic contributions to the College taken into consideration.

Students who are already being generously supported by a scholarship or bursary may not be eligible for additional support.
